

Ingalls USD 477 Out-of-District Enrollment Policy

USD 477 will accept nonresident enrollment applications from January 1st to June 15th. If the number of applications for a grade level in a school building is less than the number of available seats for that grade level in the school building, the nonresident students shall be accepted for enrollment and attendance at the school district, unless the nonresident student is deemed not in good standing. If the number of applications for a grade level in a school building is greater than the number of available seats for the grade level in the school building, district administration shall randomly select nonresident students deemed in good standing using a confidential lottery process. Available seats will be subject to change each school year. This process shall be completed on or before July 15th of each year. USD 477s class limits are listed as followed by grade level:

Ingalls USD #477 believes a collaborative partnership between school, guardian, and student greatly enhances the likelihood a student will have academic, social, and emotional success. To continue our practice of developing and maintaining relations with all stakeholders and ensuring an individualized education plan is uniquely designed for each student all out of district applicants and their guardians must:

1. Interview with the principal, this will include a building tour and a meeting with the school counselor.
2. Provide an unofficial transcript from previous school.
3. Enroll with an understanding that you and your student will participate in state testing and all school surveys to determine how we can best serve our students and their family.
4. Understand the student will follow the Ingalls Out-of-District Policy Agreement
5. Provide behavior and attendance records from the previous school.

Out-of-District students must maintain the following district expectations to continue enrollment:

1. Out-of-District students will not be accepted if he/she is serving a long-term expulsion.
2. Ingalls USD #477, at the point of enrollment, will honor all short-term suspensions, from a prior district.
3. To maintain enrollment/attendance at Ingalls Schools, out-of-district students must acquire at least a 2.0 GPA at the end of each semester. A student who falls below a 2.0 GPA will be placed on an academic contract for a 9-week probationary period to bring the GPA up. The administration will review the student's progress at that time to determine if he/she has met the terms of the contract and whether they may continue to attend.
4. To maintain enrollment/attendance at Ingalls Schools, out-of-district students must conduct good behavior while attending.
5. Continual minor disciplinary infractions may result in dismissal.
6. Failure to maintain good attendance will result in dismissal.
